

## **Workshop 2 – Maritime Safety**

### **Karlskrona, 1<sup>st</sup> of June, 2006**

The workshop will focus on preventive measures for increased maritime safety in the Baltic Sea Region. One framework for preventive measures is the PSSA (the UN designation of the Baltic Sea as a Particularly Sensitive Sea Area). What does this mean and what can be achieved in terms of better protection to the environment and safer sea transport over the Baltic Sea?

The workshop aims at discussing the PSSA concept, its limitations and possibilities, as well as other possible forms of co-operation for establishing preventive measures and joint actions in the Baltic Sea.
